It was an exciting and challenging year for the Community Bike Hub, in which we tested new ideas, welcomed new team-members, and moved our service and retail shop from Moreland Street in Footscray to Barkly Street in West Footscray.

We continue to build on our highly successful education program partnership with Footscray High School, offering practical bike repair and recycling skills for middle years students.

The 2024–2025 financial year brings a game-changing opportunity in the form of the Brimbank Traffic School – a bicycle education facility that adds to our holistic offering, from learning to ride, to recycling and refurbishing bikes. This Brimbank Traffic School complements our repair workshop and our volunteer hub.

We're also expanding our community impact through initiatives including the Spot & Cycle park ride and Empower Her Ride education program in collaboration with the City of Maribyrnong.

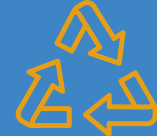

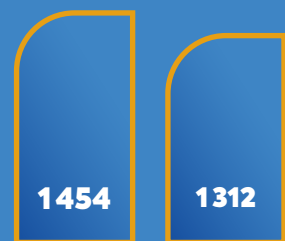

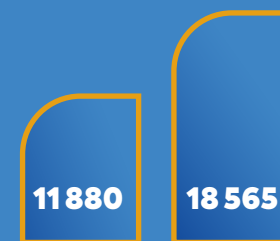
